Over 3,000 years ago, a wealthy dignitary was buried in Ancient Egypt. As part of the traditional Egyptian burial customs, his tomb was filled with various practical items such as pots and pans, furniture, food, etc. It is believed the Ancient Egyptians thought these items were for use by the deceased in the afterworld.

When this tomb was excavated a few decades ago, one such item the archaeologists discovered was a small clay jar filled with wheat. Although these wheat seeds were over 3,000 years old, the archaeologists decided to conduct a little experiment with them. butterflies!—travel thousands of miles back to the exact same spot? As Billy asks in "The Family Circus," who taught the geese to fly in a perfect aerodynamic formation?

The solution to these puzzles is in Romans 1:19: "Since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities—His eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made."

All around us every day, in the wonders of nature, we witness a marvelous testimony to God's glory! As Hebrews 11:3 says, "By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command."

This Spring, as you once again behold the greening of the grass, the leafing out of the trees, the blooming of the flowers, and the maturation of the wheat, contemplate the power and wisdom of the Creator and give thanks for the miracle of life.

New Bible Class "These Are a Few of Our Favorite Hymns"




